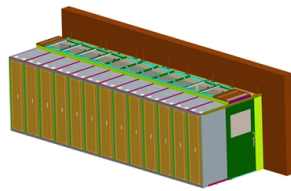


Are mineral cables not allowed in cable trays

Why MI Cables Are Not Suitable for Cable Trays

MI cables consist of copper conductors embedded in magnesium oxide insulation, enclosed in a continuous copper or stainless steel sheath, sometimes with an additional PVC jacket for corrosion protection . This design provides high temperature resistance, durability, and fire protection, making MI cables ideal for severe environments, critical emergency circuits, and hazardous locations . However, their rigid and inflexible construction prevents them from being routed easily in cable trays, which are designed for flexible or semi-flexible cables that can be laid, supported, and secured along the tray length .

NEC and Installation Considerations

According to NEC Article 330, MI cables are intended for applications requiring liquid- and gas-tight construction and high mechanical protection, often in conduit or direct burial installations . Cable trays, on the other hand, are intended for flexible tray cables (TC), metal-clad (MC) cables, or instrumentation tray cables (ITC) that are UL-listed for tray use and can be supported at intervals along the tray . MI cables cannot be bent or supported in the same manner as tray-rated cables, and their installation in trays could compromise both mechanical integrity and fire safety....
