

Distance between construction and railway fiber optic cable

Construction near railway fiber optic cables should maintain a minimum horizontal and vertical separation of at least 10 feet horizontally and 3.05 meters (10 feet) below ground, subject to railroad approval.

Minimum Separation Guidelines

When performing construction near railway fiber optic cables, it is critical to maintain safe distances to prevent damage and ensure operational integrity. According to AREMA and Union Pacific Railroad standards, fiber optic cables within railroad rights-of-way should be:

- Buried at a minimum depth of 10 feet (3.05 meters) below the natural ground surface, particularly under tracks or signal structures, unless otherwise approved by the railroad engineer .
- Horizontally separated from construction activities to avoid accidental contact with excavation equipment or heavy machinery. While specific horizontal distances may vary, maintaining a buffer zone of at least several meters from the cable alignment is recommended, with exact distances determined in coordination with the railroad .

- Trenches near railway fiber optic cables must be carefully planned, compacted, and backfilled to prevent settlement or damage to the cable
