Installation Methods for Duct Fiber Optic Cables Installing duct fiber requires specialized techniques to navigate ducts (which may have bends, joints, or obstacles). The two most common methods are pulling and air blowing —each with unique advantages and use cases. To ensure all specifications are met, consult the specific cable specification sheet for the cable you. Conventional trenching is suitable for open areas, while narrow trenching or horizontal directional drilling (HDD) is often preferred in urban or high-traffic environments to minimize disruption during underground fiber optic cable installation. 2 meters (3-4 feet) deep to reduce the likelihood of accidentally being dug up. In extreme cold climates, cables may need to be buried at greater depths where there temperatures are colder and frost penetrates to. Underground placement is necessary and unavoidable in certain areas for various reasons such as nature and heritage conservation, natural obstacles, aesthetics, space and safety. More than one technique can be used in the same network based on the specific circumstances of the network building.
