### Core Count

The core count refers to the number of individual glass fibers within a cable. Common core counts include 1, 2, 6, 8, 12, 24, 48, 72, 144, and higher, depending on the application.

- Low-count cables (2-12 cores) are typically used for point-to-point connections or small office/campus networks.
- Medium-count cables (24-72 cores) are used for enterprise backbones and campus links, supporting multiple connections and future expansion.
- High-density cables (144-864+ cores) are used in metropolitan, carrier, or long-haul networks where large-scale aggregation is required ....
