Intrinsically safe (Ex i) prevents ignition entirely by limiting energy. Do hazardous area enclosures need special cable glands?

Yes. Cable glands must match the enclosure type (Ex d, Ex e, Ex t, etc.) and maintain the integrity of the protection. NEC (NFPA 70) – defines requirements for Class I, II, and III hazardous (classified) locations and permits explosion-proof equipment in many Class I Division 1 and Division 2 applications.
