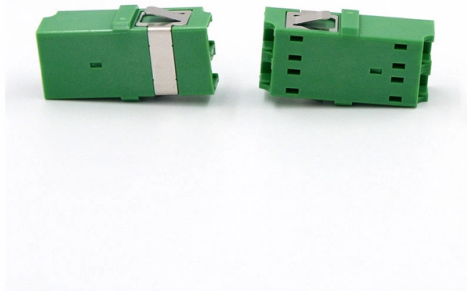


How many layers should a core switch have
