

How much distance should the cable tray be from the plate



Overview

Support spacing for cable trays must align with the manufacturer's instructions, as outlined in NEC 392. Generally, standard trays require supports every 6 to 10 feet, while heavy-duty, long-span trays can handle distances of up to 20 feet between supports. The NEC has a requirement for ladder-type cable trays. The rungs cannot be more than 9 inches apart. For single conductor cables ranging from 1/0 AWG to 4/0 AWG, ensure the rungs are spaced no more than 9 inches apart. Solid-bottom trays provide continuous shielding against electromagnetic interference (EMI), making them ideal for sensitive circuits like data and control cables. The cable tray should have sufficient rigidity and strength to provide reliable support for the cables. Maintaining this clearance ensures: The vertical safety distance should.
