

How to identify the A and B ends of an outdoor optical cable



Overview

A Visual Fault Locator (VFL) can help verify this polarity by sending the visible red laser light through the fiber and tracking its path to the other end of the fiber cable connector. 0 Standard (Commercial Building Telecommunications Cabling Standard) defines the A-B polarity scenario for discrete duplex patch cords, with the premise that transmit (Tx) should always go to receive (Rx) — or "B" should always connect to "A" — no matter how many segments there are. Polarity is managed through various cabling standards and methods (Types A, B, and C), which control how fibers are aligned in multi-fiber connections. This ensures consistent Tx/Rx matching across all connections, making it possible for complex network systems to operate without interruptions. As shown in the diagram below, it is easy to see that Tx (B) should always connect to Rx (A), regardless of how many patch panel adapters or cable segments are in the channel. Although it may seem obvious, fiber optic polarity is a frequent source of confusion and.
