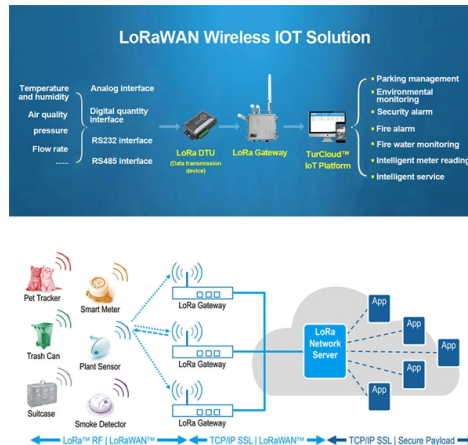


Identifying the A and B ends of the optical cable



AI Overview

The A and B ends of optical cables are identified using TIA-568 polarity standards, connector key orientation, and fiber mapping, typically implemented through Method A, Method B, or Method C with Type A, B, or C MTP/MPO cables.

Understanding A-B Polarity

In fiber optic networks, A-B polarity ensures that the transmit (Tx) port on one end connects to the receive (Rx) port on the other end, maintaining proper signal flow and preventing communication errors (Tx→Tx or Rx→Rx). For duplex LC or SC patch cords, the "A" end is typically the transmit side, and the "B" end is the receive side. When facing a connector in the key-up position, B is on the left and A is on the right.

Methods for Identifying Ends

Method A (Straight-Through)

- Uses a Type A MTP/MPO trunk cable with opposite key orientations on each end (key up vs key down).
- Fiber positions are one-to-one mapped, meaning fiber 1 at one end connects directly to fiber 1 at the other end.
- Standard A-to-B duplex patch cords are used on both sides to maintain correct polarity
