

Precautions for plugging and unplugging pigtails



Overview

Verify three-prong plugs are intact with ground pins present—never remove or bend ground pins. Ensure cords are properly rated for their intended use—outdoor, indoor, amperage capacity. An electrical shock can occur when unplugging cords from electrical outlets. This happens when the plug's “hot prong” is partially exposed while still in the outlet and a finger comes into contact. This technique involves creating short wire segments that isolate the device, preventing common failure points that lead to electrical issues.
