- Straight Pulls: Conduits enter and exit on opposite sides. The box length should be at least 8 times the diameter of the largest conduit to allow proper bending and pulling of wires.
- Angle Pulls: Conduits enter and exit on adjacent sides. The distance from the entry point to the far wall should be 6 times the diameter of the largest conduit
