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Inside the cable is a core made of glass or plastic. A light signal (usually from an LED) travels through the core by bouncing off the cladding. It stays inside the cable until it reaches the receiving device. ...

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Optical or "Toslink" cables use light to transfer audio through optical fibers. Audio signals must be converted from an electrical signal to an optical one before traveling through the cable.

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
