

Where should the grounding of the construction site s electrical distribution box be connected



Overview

Although the grounded conductor is connected on the supply side, it shall not be connected to the EGCs or reconnected to ground on the load side of the service disconnection means except as otherwise permitted in the 2017 NEC Article 250. A grounding terminal or grounding-type device on a receptacle, cord connector, or attachment plug shall not be used for purposes other than grounding. Branch circuits - Ground-fault protection - General. The employer shall use either ground fault circuit interrupters as specified in paragraph (b). This subpart addresses electrical safety requirements that are necessary for the practical safeguarding of employees involved in construction work and is divided into four major divisions and applicable definitions as follows: (a) Installation safety requirements. In an airplane, for example, the fuselage acts as the ground. Paragraph (d) of this section also applies to protective grounding of other equipment as required elsewhere in this Subpart. Not all boxes are metal or provide. Proper grounding is the non-negotiable foundation of electrical safety.
